

Ed Marynowitz

Assistant Director of Player Personnel



Ed Marynowitz (pronounced man-o-witz) is in his third year with the Eagles and his second as the team's assistant director of player personnel. Marynowitz spent the 2012 season as the team's assistant director of pro scouting.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Marynowitz spent four years with the University of Alabama (2008-11) as the program's director of player personnel, directing the team's football recruiting efforts. He also served as the liaison between Alabama and NFL scouts and assisted in the day-to-day administration and operation of the football program.

During his time in Tuscaloosa, Marynowitz was instrumental in helping construct three straight consensus No. 1 recruiting classes, while all five classes during his time at Alabama ranked in the top five in the country. From his recruiting classes with the Tide, six players have been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. Additionally, seven players have earned AP All-American honors, while six have garnered first-team All-SEC accolades. The Tide went 36-5 during his three seasons with the team, winning the BCS National Championship in 2009 and 2011.

He joined the Crimson Tide after a one-year stint as a scouting assistant with the Miami Dolphins (2007), where he worked under Bill Parcells and Jeff Ireland. While with the Dolphins, he worked in both the pro and college scouting departments where he assisted with the advance scouting of opponents, evaluation of both draft eligible college prospects and NFL free agents, the execution of free-agent workouts, the monitoring of daily league transactions and the maintenance of the scouting databases.

Prior to his time with the Dolphins, Marynowitz spent two years on staff at the University of Central Florida under George O'Leary. As a graduate assistant in 2006, he worked primarily with football operations before joining the staff on a full-time basis for the 2007 season as the Knights' recruiting administrator. In that role, Marynowitz directed the on-campus recruiting efforts in addition to assisting with day-to-day operations of the program.

Marynowitz began his collegiate playing career as a two-year starter at quarterback at La Salle University in Philadelphia. He earned honorable mention All-American honors in 2003 as a sophomore and holds a number of the school's passing records. He finished his playing career at UCF as a reserve quarterback on the 2005 Hawaii Bowl team.

Marynowitz earned his bachelor's degree in business management in the spring of 2006 from Central Florida. He finished his master's in business administration in December of 2007 and then a second master's degree in sports business management from UCF's DeVos Sport Business Management Program in May of 2008. Born in Media, PA, he and his wife, Codie, live in Philadelphia.
